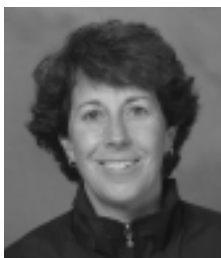

SUE BEHME
Head Coach

Sue Behme's arrival at Nazareth prior to the 2000 season infused into the women's lacrosse program high levels of energy and enthusiasm that have culminated in seven straight postseason appearances, including five NCAA tournament berths.

The Golden Flyers' fledgling program was on the verge of making a splash at the national

level prior to her arrival. Then they dove headfirst into the national spotlight in 2000 as Behme (pronounced Beam) guided the Golden Flyers to their finest season ever. Nazareth won a school-record 16 games, won the championship of the Empire 8 Conference, and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time.

They subsequently won E8 titles in 2002, 2005 and 2006 with Behme earning conference Coach of the Year honors in each of those seasons. The Golden Flyers also reached the NCAA Tournament as an at-large selection in 2004.

Under Behme's direction, the Golden Flyers enjoyed one of their best seasons ever in 2006 as they finished the regular season as one of only three unbeaten teams (14-0) in the country. After winning the Empire 8 Conference Tournament for the second year in a row, Nazareth received a first-round bye to the NCAA Tournament, then lost a tough 10-7 decision to Franklin & Marshall. Behme was recognized as NYSWCAA Coach of the Year and Empire Region Coach of the Year.

The Golden Flyers enjoyed their share of success in 2001 and 2003 as well. They finished second (behind Ithaca) in the Empire 8 Conference each time and competed in the ECAC Mid-Atlantic Tournament. Behme has a record of 92-31 in her seven seasons at Nazareth and an overall record of 113-53 for 11 seasons.

Behme joined the Nazareth coaching staff in the fall of 1999 and brought with her strong credentials both as a coach and as a player.

She coached soccer and lacrosse at SUNY Geneseo for four years. Her soccer teams posted a record of 38-32-1 and captured the NYSWCAA title in 1998. She started the Geneseo lacrosse program in 1996 and built the program into one of the best in the SUNY Athletic Conference. Her 1999 team finished with a 9-4 record and reached the conference playoffs. She also was named conference coach of the year.

Behme also has had coaching stints in lacrosse and soccer at Washington & Lee University in Lexington, Va. and at the University of the South in Sewanee, Tenn.

As an athlete, Behme was a collegiate All-American in both soccer and lacrosse at SUNY Cortland. In soccer, she helped the Red Dragons to a national championship in 1992 while earning All-America honors. She was a two-time All-American in lacrosse and was selected to compete in the North-South Senior all-star game in 1993.

Her competitive fire led to her selection in 2005 to the U.S. Team handball Women's National Team. She formerly played semi-professional soccer with the Rochester Ravens and raced mountain bikes professionally for two years with Ted Wojick Custom Bikes of Hampstead, N.H.

Behme graduated from Cortland in 1993 with a degree in Recreation and Leisure Studies. She has a Master's degree in recreation from Brockport.

In addition to coaching lacrosse, Behme oversees the athletic department's equipment room. During the summer she operates the popular girls lacrosse camp at Nazareth. This year's camp is June 25-29, 2007.

After a brilliant four-year playing career for the Golden Flyers, Shawna Kabot returns to Nazareth for her third season as an assistant coach.

Kabot graduated in 2004 with a degree in Communication Science and Disorders and now has a Master's

degree in Speech Pathology.

She earned numerous individual honors as a lacrosse player and ranks fourth all-time at Nazareth in career scoring with 204 points on 175 goals and 29 assists.

Kabot was a first-team Empire 8 Conference all-star selection four straight years and was co-Player of the Year in 2003. She also was a four-time all-NYSWCAA selection and a regional All-American pick three times.

In 2004, Kabot was the Golden Flyers' team captain and leading scorer with 50 points on 42 goals and eight assists. She led the Golden Flyers to a 14-4 record and an NCAA Tournament selection. She scored six goals in the Golden Flyers' 12-5 first-round tournament victory over Wooster.

Kabot was selected to compete in the annual North-South Senior all-star game and was Nazareth's 2004 recipient of the Bill Carey Sportsmanship Award.

Kabot is a native of Horseheads, N.Y. and excelled in basketball and lacrosse at Horseheads High School.

Former Nazareth defensive standout Lindsay Gotham joined the women's lacrosse coaching staff this spring after a fine four-year playing career that culminated with her selection as a first-team All-American in 2005.

A native of Seneca Falls, N.Y., Gotham was a four-year starter as a defender and was a four-time first-team Empire 8 Conference all-star. She also was a three-time regional All-American. Gotham helped the Golden Flyers to a four-year record of 50-18 with two conference titles and three NCAA Tournament berths.

Gotham graduated from Nazareth in '05 with a degree in psychology.

Nazareth seeking third straight E8 title, NCAA berth

Now in her 12th season as a women's college lacrosse coach (and her eighth at Nazareth), Sue Behme has been able to see the bigger picture and is thus unfazed in losing players to graduation.

"Graduation is a fact of life," said Behme, who lost eight players from the Golden Flyers' 2006 Empire 8 Conference championship team, including two first-team All-Americans. "I don't get hung up on that. I feel confident that anyone on our team can step in and do the job when the time comes."

Last season, the Golden Flyers did a job on many of their opponents as they finished 14-1 overall and captured their fourth Empire 8 Conference championship.

They also made their fifth NCAA Tournament appearance under Behme's direction. They entered the tournament unbeaten and received a first-round bye, then lost a close game to Franklin & Marshall, 10-7.

Defense has served as the Golden Flyers' calling card in recent seasons and it was never more evident than in 2006 when they led all of Division III with the lowest goals-against average (4.73) and were ninth in scoring margin (7.33).

"We want to be as balanced as possible," said Behme, whose 113 career wins rank among the best in Division III. "I think we have some very good team speed that should make us dangerous to defend."

Nazareth lost its starting goalie, Heather Chaapel, who was named Division III's top goalie after posting a stingy 4.43 goals-against average and a .628 save percentage in '06.

Defender Betsy Carney, a first-team All-American and the team's fourth leading scorer also is gone, along with reliable players Sandy Tompkins and Kristyn Lingenfelter. The offense also took a hit with the graduation

losses of Kim Kreskow, Amy O'Donnell and Melissa Passno, three of the team's top six scorers.

Sophomore Maria Fusco played in nine games as a backup to Chaapel in '06 and is poised to play more in 2007. Freshman Ann Sessler is the team's other goalie.

Senior Liz Wells, a first-team E8 all-star, and sophomore Hannah Brennan, a second-team selection, return as defensive starters.

Senior Sarah Mack, junior Eireann Byrne and sophomore Mary Kate Scardillo also earned playing time last season. Defensive newcomers include freshmen Nicole Cottone, Lauren Evans, Melissa George, Kelly Lighton and Jamie Robison.

Senior Tia Morgia, the Golden Flyers' leading scorer in 2005 and 2006 and a two-time E8 all-star, is probably the team's steadiest offensive player. Junior Beth Quartier also returns with 50 career goals to her credit.

Seniors Colleen Earley and Jessica McArdle each played regularly in 2006 as did juniors Allison Bayer and Sara Spillane and sophomore Jessica Caprara.

Newcomers at attack are freshmen Stephanie Cash, Nora Davis, Lauren Kostuk, Alyssia Roberts and Korinne Smith and sophomore Stephanie Lattimore

Senior Caitlin Zimmer (38 career goals) is the Golden Flyers' most experienced midfielder. Juniors Caity Richardson and Rachel Baranello also have played along with sophomores Maggie Mullin and Katie Schneeberger. Freshman Jennifer Young also will compete for playing time.

"It's a unique group in that we have great mentorship from the upperclassmen," said Behme, who will be assisted by Shawna Kabot, Lindsay Gotham and Rachel Spoonhower. "Everything has been very positive on and off the field."

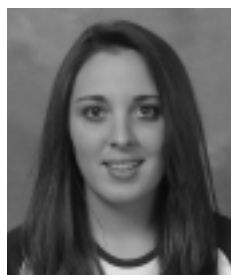

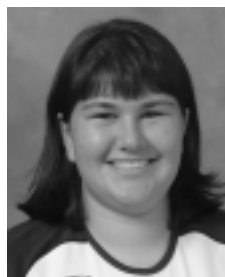

Nazareth College is a private, co-educational college with a liberal arts and sciences tradition. Founded in 1924 by the Sisters of St. Joseph, Nazareth has been independent for more than 30 years.

Nazareth's athletic mission and philosophy

The Nazareth College Athletic Department will strive to empower its student-athletes to grow as people and make a positive impact on society, with life-skills development, mentoring, and leadership opportunities through competitive and cooperative experiences.

The Athletic Department is committed to assisting in the college's mission of educating students with a goal of fostering lifelong commitment to intellectual, ethical and aesthetic values. The Athletic Department will operate under firm institutional control of the college and will always place the health and welfare of the student-athletes, coaches and staff first in decisions regarding the athletics program.

The department will operate under the NCAA Division III philosophy, through which academics are the student's first priority and sportsmanship, fair play, diversity and ethical conduct are constantly taught and promoted.

Campus expansion

2004 marked the completion of Nazareth's largest capital campaign in history. The college raised \$25 million to support the recent campus expansion through the purchase of 73 acres of adjoining land and buildings. Today's campus features 148 acres and includes the five-story Golisano Academic Center, the 2,200-seat Golden Flyer Stadium, the spacious Elizabeth George and Portka residence halls and a softball diamond.

Students now have twice as many classrooms and computer labs; more undergraduate and graduate programs; opportunities to compete on intercollegiate teams in equestrian, cross country, track and field, men's volleyball, and women's softball; and a choice of living options that includes suites, cafes and free laundry service.

Enrollment

Full-time undergraduate enrollment for the fall of 2007 will be approximately 1,925. That number increases to about 3,200 with the inclusion of part-time and graduate students. There are more than 1,250 students living on campus.

The 2006-07 freshman class had a mean SAT score of 1120. One quarter of incoming freshmen finished in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class; two-thirds ranked in the top 25 percent.

- The Nazareth College Arts Center, which houses the departments of Theatre Arts, Music, and Art, has welcomed more than two million people to performances since it opened in 1967.

Community service

Ninety-one percent of Nazareth undergraduates participate in community service projects while they are students.

In addition, Nazareth offers an on-campus Center for Service Learning, which serves as a resource for students seeking volunteer placements and for faculty who want to incorporate service into the curriculum.

Alumni

Seventy-five percent of Nazareth's 23,000 alumni reside in New York state. Nearly 70 percent are employed in service professions including education, health care, child care, social work, and counseling.

Athletic highlights

- The average grade-point average of student-athletes for the spring 2006 semester was 3.20, a number that includes academic records for more than 400 student-athletes.
- A member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Nazareth has 22 intercollegiate teams that compete at the Division III level. Nazareth competes in the Empire 8 Conference with Alfred, Elmira, Hartwick, Ithaca, RIT, St. John Fisher, Stevens Tech, and Utica.
- Nazareth's men's lacrosse team won national championships in 1992, 1996, and 1997.
- Nazareth finished 96th in the NACDA (National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics) standings for Division III in 2005-06. The Golden Flyers were represented in NCAA Tournaments in men's soccer, women's swimming and diving, men's track and field, and women's lacrosse. Nazareth also claimed Empire 8 Conference titles in men's soccer, women's soccer, and women's lacrosse.
