





HEAD COACH & YEAR BY YEAR



GAIL MANN Head Coach

Returning for her 14th season as Nazareth's women's soccer coach, Gail Mann has helped the Golden Flyers maintain their standing among the nation's elite programs for more than a decade.

Last year's 13-6-2 record marked the Golden Flyers' 11th straight season of double digit victories and culminated with the ECAC Upstate

title. In addition, Nazareth has either shared or won outright the Empire 8 Conference championship for seven straight years.

Nazareth also made six straight NCAA tournament appearances from 1997 through 2002. Only a few stray penalty kicks denied them berths in 2003, 2004 and 2005.

Mann has been at the coaching forefront for all of the Golden Flyers' most significant achievements since taking over as coach in 1993. In just her second season, the Golden Flyers finished 9-8-2 and reached the NYSWCAA Tournament. In 1996, they rolled to a 16-6-1 record and secured berths in both the NYSWCAA and ECAC Tournaments.

Nazareth's steady progression continued under Mann's direction in 1997 as the team finished 16-1-2 and landed its first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. Nazareth's first NCAA game was a memorable one – a thrilling 3-2 triple overtime win over Oneonta. Mann was

recognized that year as New York Region Coach of the Year, an honor that was duplicated in 2002.

In 1999, Nazareth set a school record with 17 wins and captured the NCAA New York Region title and Mann was honored as Empire 8 co-Coach of the Year. Nazareth equaled that school record in 2002 by finishing 17-4-1.

Mann's 13-year coaching record of 166-67-20 computes to a .696 winning percentage, which ranks among the top 20 active coaches in Division III. Since 1995 she has coached 45 NYSWCAA all-stars, 33 regional All-Americans and five national All-Americans.

A native of Rochester, Mann came to Nazareth in '93 after five seasons as an assistant coach at SUNY Brockport. She was head coach of the New York West Olympic Development U-15 team from 1992-1998 and led the team to the Region 1 championship in 1995.

Mann graduated from Spencerport High School, where she excelled in soccer, basketball and softball. She played soccer at SUNY Cortland and was a starting striker on the 1986 team that reached the Division III Final Four.

At Nazareth, in addition to coaching soccer, Mann was an assistant coach for the Golden Flyers' women's lacrosse team for 10 seasons (1995-2004) and helped the team to three NCAA tournament berths. She now serves as advisor to the Student Athlete Advisory Committee.

ASST COACHES, POST SEASON



BILLY STOJANOVSKI Assistant Coach

Billy Stojanovski joined the Nazareth coaching staff in 2000 and has helped guide the Golden Flyers to six Empire 8 Conference titles and three NCAA tournament berths. Along with serving as the Golden Flyers' head assistant,

Stojanovski trains the goalkeepers.

A native of Rochester, Stojanovski played three seasons of soccer at Division I University of Buffalo as a goalkeeper and still ranks among the program's all-time leaders in saves and goals-against average. He graduated from Buffalo with a degree in mechanical engineering and has worked at Xerox since 1994.

Before coming to Nazareth, Stojanovski was an assistant coach at RIT for three seasons. He also has coached the Rochester Junior Rhinos since 1998 and helped direct them to a state title in 1999.

His coaching experience also includes a stint with Buffalo Germania from 1994-97 (two State Cup Championships and two regional appearances, and the first New York State West girls club team to reach the regional semifinals) and involvement with the Rochester District Olympic Development program.

He also has assisted in the women's scholastic division of the Empire State Games and has helped the Western New York team to five gold medals and one bronze medal in the past six years.

Stojanovski resides in Rochester with his wife, Cheryl, daughter Reese and son Evan.



S A N D Y B R O D Y Assistant Coach

Sandy Brody begins her fourth season with the Golden Flyers as a part-time assistant coach. Brody grew up in Florida and excelled in soccer, softball, and volleyball at Taravella High in Coral Springs. She went on to play Division I soccer at the University of North Carolina-Asheville, where she helped the team win

the Big South Conference title in 1995.

She graduated from UNC Asheville in 1997 with a degree in Mathematics. Since then, she has fulfilled teaching requirements in physical education and has had teaching assignments at Marcus Whitman Central in Rushville, N.Y. and at Brighton Central. She also has experience as an area soccer official.

Brody resides in Rochester with her husband, Harlan, and works as a real estate manager.

GOLDEN FLYERS WIN ECAC TITLE

Nazareth shares E8 crown with Ithaca again.

Although it wasn't the ultimate prize for which all teams strive, the ECAC Upstate title that the Nazareth women's soccer team captured in 2005 did enable the Golden Flyers to close the season on a positive note.

"It isn't often that you can do that," said Nazareth Coach Gail Mann, who guided the Golden Flyers to an overall record of 13-6-2 in her 13th season at Nazareth. "It was a nice way to finish our season and gives us something to build upon."



In the Fredonia game, Kristina Cristofori's unassisted goal early in the second half was the difference.

Then against Geneseo, Nazareth got first-half goals from Julie Birbilis (directly off a corner kick), Rachel Cushman and Meagan Clark to take a commanding advantage and held on to win the title.

During the regular season, Nazareth split its first four games to stand at 2-2 before emerging to win seven of its next eight games.

Naturally, the Golden Flyers would have preferred to be the Empire 8 Conference's representative in the NCAA Tournament, but they were denied that chance via penalty kicks for the third year in a row.

Nazareth and Ithaca have shared the Empire 8 Conference title for four years in a row and have needed penalty kicks to determine the E8's NCAA rep. Nazareth prevailed through that precarious format in 2002, while Ithaca has turned the Golden Flyers away in 2003, 2004 and 2005.

In '05, the teams settled for a 1-1 tie during the regular season, then played 110 minutes of scoreless soccer in the conference championship game Nov. 4 at Golden Flyer Stadium to become co-champions again. Ithaca then converted five PKs to Nazareth's four to claim the conference's automatic berth.

The consolation prize for Nazareth was the right to host the ECAC Upstate Tournament and the Golden Flyers defeated Fredonia (1-0) and Geneseo (3-1) on successive November days to claim their first-ever ECAC title.

Nazareth defeated St. John Fisher, 4-3, to win its first-round game in the E8 tournament to set up yet another evenly matched showdown with Ithaca.

Cristofori, a first-team E8 all-star as a center midfielder, was Nazareth's leading scorer for the second year in a row with 30 points on 12 goals and six assists.

Cushman, a freshman, also emerged as a dependable offensive threat by contributing 11 goals and two assists. Junior Rosie Simiele and freshman Sandi Toth each scored six times.

Cristofori, Simiele and senior defender Meagan Clark were selected as first-team E8 all-stars, while Cushman was named to the second team along with freshman midfielder Ashley Clinton and senior defender Randi Hughes.

GOLDEN FLYERS AIM FOR E8

2006 Season Preview

Perhaps it's a calm before the storm or simply the head coach's attempt to downplay her team's 2006 fortunes.

Gail Mann, now in her 14th season as head coach of the Nazareth women's soccer team, isn't sure how to describe it.

Missing from her early season expectations is the typically unsettling sense of urgency that has categorized the Golden Flyers in seasons past.

Even though the Golden Flyers have been regular post-season participants for the better part of the past decade, Mann feels a sense of tranquility as she treads toward 2006.

Missing from the team's arsenal are a pair of first-team all-conference performers in defender Meagan Clark and center midfielder Kristina Cristofori, each of whom contributed mightily to the Golden Flyers' 13-6-2 record and ECAC Upstate championship in 2005.

"We have the potential to be a very good team," said Mann, who has averaged nearly 13 victories per season as Nazareth's head coach, "but we're still very young."

Now that the freshmen have matured into sophomores, Mann believes the key to the Golden Flyers' 2006 fortunes could center on how well her second-year players have developed. "I think we're good enough to compete for the Empire 8 title" she said.

Here's a position-by-position breakdown:

FORWARD


Shuffling between forward and midfield, Cristofori provided a good portion of the Golden Flyers' offense by scoring 23 goals over the past two seasons.

Mann believes that sophomore Rachel Cushman could carry Nazareth's offense in '06 after she contributed 11 goals and two assists and earned second-team E 8 all-star honors as a freshman. Mann also is excited to have Caroline Parsons, a sophomore in terms of eligibility, back at full strength after she battled knee problems the past two seasons. Sophomores Kelly Finn and Taryn

Bilodeau should also play more prominent roles in '06.

MIDFIELD

With Cristofori gone, senior Rosie Simiele is the likely candidate to inherit the center midfield position that has proven so vital in the past. She contributed six goals and five assists as a starting striker in 2005 and was a first-team all-conference selection.

Junior Julie Birbilis and senior Jessemyn Russell return to run along the outside while senior Jessica Rogers takes over as a defensive midfielder.

Junior Caity Richardson and sophomore Sandi Toth will also help here along with senior Kim Yancone. New players are Alicia Franceschi, Alicca Kowalczyk, Kathleen Niland and Caitlin Welch.

DEFENSE

The Golden Flyers took a significant hit with the graduation of Clark, who was named MVP of the ECAC Tournament. Despite that, Mann is confident that the Golden Flyers' defense can be stingier than the 1.10 goals per game it yielded last season.

Sophomore Ashley Clinton started every game in 2005 and should be even better this season. Other possible back-line starters are senior Amanda Prosser, junior Maggie Boyle and sophomores Carly Schurman and Emily Zurschmit.

Newcomers are Maggie Dawidczyk and Laura Finan.

GOALIE

Sophomore Shannon Burns used up most of the minutes in goal last season and will be backed up in '06 by a pair of promising freshmen in Kiera DeNoyer and Polly Muehlenkamp.

"We have very good speed, some people who can finish and our chemistry is excellent," said Mann, who will be assisted once again by Billy Stojanovski and Sandy Brody. "It's a good team, but only time will tell if we can be a great team."







Nazareth's athletic mission and philosophy

The Athletic Department is committed to assisting in the college's mission of educating students with a goal of fostering lifelong commitment to intellectual, ethical and aesthetic values. The Athletic Department will operate under firm institutional control of the college and will always place the health and welfare of the student-athletes, coaches and staff first in decisions regarding the athletics program.

The department will operate under the NCAA Division III philosophy, through which academics are the student's first priority and sportsmanship, fair play, diversity and ethical conduct are constantly taught and promoted.

Campus expansion

2004 marked the completion of Nazareth's largest capital campaign in history. The college raised \$25 million to support the recent campus expansion through the purchase of 73 acres of adjoining land and buildings. Today's campus features 148 acres and includes the five-story Golisano Academic Center, the 2,200-seat Golden Flyer Stadium, the spacious Elizabeth George and Portka residence halls and a softball diamond.

Students now have twice as many classrooms and computer labs; more undergraduate and graduate programs; opportunities to compete on intercollegiate teams in equestrian, cross country, track and field, men's volleyball, and women's softball; and a choice of living options that includes suites, cafes and free laundry service.

Full-time undergraduate enrollment for the fall of 2007 will be approximately 1,925. That number increases to about 3,200 with the inclusion of part-time and graduate students. There are more than 1,250 students living on campus.

The 2006-07 freshman class had a mean SAT score of 1120. One quarter of incoming freshmen finished in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class; two-thirds ranked in the top 25 percent.

- Nazareth has a distinguished history of teacher preparation with nearly 1,700 graduates currently teaching in Monroe County classrooms.
- Nazareth features an array of health professions programs, including a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Music Therapy, Art Therapy, Speech-Language Pathology, and Physical Therapy.
- The Nazareth College Arts Center, which houses the departments of Theatre Arts, Music, and Art, has welcomed more than two million people to performances since it opened in 1967.

Community service

Ninety-one percent of Nazareth undergraduates participate in community service projects while they are students.

In addition, Nazareth offers an oncampus Center for Service Learning, which serves as a resource for students seeking volunteer placements and for faculty who want to incorporate service into the curriculum.

Alumni

Seventy-five percent of Nazareth's 23,000 alumni reside in New York state. Nearly 70 percent are employed in service professions including education, health care, child care, social work, and counseling.

Athletic highlights

- The average grade-point average of student-athletes for the spring 2006 semester was 3.20, a number that includes academic records for more than 400 studentathletes
- A member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Nazareth has 22 intercollegiate teams that compete at the Division III level. Nazareth competes in the Empire 8 Conference with Alfred, Elmira, Hartwick, Ithaca, RIT, St. John Fisher, Stevens Tech, and Utica.
- Nazareth's men's lacrosse team won national championships in 1992, 1996, and 1997.
- Nazareth finished 96th in the NACDA (National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics) standings for Division III in 2005-06. The Golden Flyers were represented in NCAA Tournaments in men's soccer, women's swimming and diving, men's track and field, and women's lacrosse. Nazareth also claimed Empire 8 Conference titles in men's soccer, women's soccer, and women's lacrosse.
