



EAD COACH, GAIL MANN



Nazareth Women's Soccer Head Coach, Gail Mann



Returning for her 11th season as head coach of the women's soccer team, Gail Mann is by far the Golden Flyers' most successful women's soccer coach ever – in terms of victories, longevity, and post-season success.

Last year's record of 17-4-1 marked the Golden Flyers' eighth straight season of double-digit victories and Mann was recognized as New York Region Coach of the Year. The Golden Flyers also won the Empire 8 Conference title for the fourth year in a row and received their sixth straight invitation to the NCAA Division III tournament. Their 17 victories equaled a school record set in 1999 when the Golden Flyers won the NCAA's New York Region title and advanced to the national quarterfinals.

Mann has been at the driving force behind all of the Golden Flyers' foremost achievements since taking over as coach in 1993. In just her second season, the Golden Flyers finished 9-8-2 and reached the NYSWCAA tournament. In 1996, Mann guided the Golden Flyers to a record of 16-6-1, and led the team to berths in the NYSWCAA and ECAC Mid-Atlantic Tournaments.

The progression continued in 1997 as Nazareth finished 16-1-2 and landed its first NCAA Tournament berth. Nazareth's first NCAA game was a memorable one – a 3-2 triple overtime win over Oneonta. Mann was recognized that year as New York Region Coach of the Year, an honor that was duplicated last season. She also was named NYSWCAA Coach of the Year in 1996 and Empire 8 co-Coach of the Year in 1999.

Mann's overall record of 131-51-12 gives her a winning percentage (.706) that ranks among the top 20 in Division III for active coaches. Her winning percentage is .775 (118-31-9) over the last eight seasons. Since 1995, she has coached 31 NYSWCAA All-Star selections, 24 Northeast Region All-Stars, and four All-Americans, including Heidi Brown last season.

A native of Rochester, Mann came to Nazareth in 1993 after five seasons as an assistant coach at SUNY Brockport. She was head coach of the New York West Olympic Development U-15 team from 1992-1998 and won the Region 1 championship in 1995.

Mann, 38, is a graduate of Spencerport High School, where she excelled in soccer, basketball, and softball. She played soccer at Cortland State and was a starting striker on the 1986 team which reached the Division III Final Four. At Nazareth, in addition to coaching soccer, Mann is an assistant coach for the Golden Flyers' women's lacrosse team, which reached the NCAA Tournament in 2000 and 2002.

Nazareth Women's Soccer Assistant Coach, Billy Stojanovski



Billy Stojanovski joined the Nazareth coaching staff in 2000 and has helped guide the Golden Flyers to three NCAA Tournamnent berths.

A native of Rochester, Stojanovski played three seasons of soccer at Division I University of Buffalo as a goalkeeper and still ranks among the program's all-time leaders in saves and goals-against average.

He graduated from Buffalo with a degree in mechanical engineering and has worked at Xerox since 1994.

Before coming to Nazareth, Stojanovski was an assistant coach at RIT for three seasons. He also has coached the Rochester Junior Rhinos since 1998 and helped direct them to a state title in 1999. His coaching experience also includes a stint with Buffalo Germania from 1994-97 and involvement with the

Rochester District Olympic Development program. Stojanovski resides in Rochester with his wife, Cheryl, whom he married in 2001.

Nazareth Women's Soccer Assistant Coach, Sandy Dror



Sandy Dror begins her first season with the Golden Flyers as a part-time assistant coach. Born in Israel, Dror excelled in soccer, softball, and volleyball at Taravella High in Coral Springs, Fla. She went on to play Division I soccer at the University of North Carolina-Asheville, where she helped the team win the Big South Conference title in 1995..

She graduated from UNC Asheville in 1997 with a degree in Mathematics. Since then, she has had teaching assignments at Marcus Whitman Central in Rushville, N.Y. and at Brighton Central. At Marcus Whitman, she coached modified soccer and was the advisor to the ski club. She also has experience as an area soccer official. Dror resides in Rochester and works as a real estate manager.

Golden Flyers are E8 co-champs, reach NCAAs again – Team finishes 17-4-1, Heidi Brown earns All-America honors.

The loss of eight contributing seniors from a strong 2002 women's soccer team will make reloading a bit more challenging for the Golden Flyers in 2003.

The Golden Flyers in 2002 picked up where their predecessors left off as the Golden Flyers equaled a school record with 17 victories, were declared co-champions of the Empire 8 Conference, and reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth year in a row.

"We relied pretty heavily on our seniors to carry us," said head coach Gail Mann, who completed her 10th season. "It was one of the strongest senior classes we've ever had."

For starters, sweeper Heidi Brown was honored as a secondteam All-American as well as Empire 8 Conference Player of the Year. In addition, striker Jaime Snyder amassed 29 points on nine goals and 11 assists to lead the Golden Flyers in scoring for the third year in a row.

Brown, Snyder, and midfielder Stephanie Nardini each were named first-team Empire 8 Conference All-Stars. Nardini and Snyder earned that distinction for an unprecedented fourth straight time.

Striker Casey Corcoran (7 goals, 6 assists) was a second-team all-conference selection.

Nazareth gained its sixth straight NCAA berth after a thrilling showdown with Ithaca in the conference championship game. The teams were scoreless through 110 minutes, including two overtimes and thus were declared conference co-champs. The Golden Flyers, however, were awarded the conference's automatic NCAA bid thanks to a 4-2 edge in penalty kicks. Snyder, Nardini and Leigh Vainio scored Nazareth's first three goals and goalie Candace Hatcher made a diving save on Ithaca's third attempt. Laura Mallia came through with the decisive kick, drilling a shot into the upper right corner to send the Nazareth faithful into a frenzy.

"It was one of the most intense and exciting games I've ever been a part of," said Mann, who became frustrated by the scoreless outcome despite her team's 21-4 edge in shots.

In the NCAAs, Nazareth defeated Grove City (Pa.) in a first-round game, 3-2, as Snyder scored twice and Mallia once.

Nazareth met a familiar foe in the next round in William Smith and the Golden Flyers' season came to a disappointing end in similar fashion to the way it started – in penalty kicks. Tied 1-1 after 110 minutes, the teams went to penalty kicks and William Smith advanced with a 4-3 edge.

"It only took a week for us to find out how Ithaca felt when they lost to us," Mann said. "It was a shame for our season to end that way."

The fact that Nazareth reached the NCAAs was less than surprising after the Golden Flyers went unbeaten (11-0-1) through the first 12 games. Regular-season losses to Ithaca, William Smith, and Rochester provided some concern, but the Golden Flyers regrouped in time for a 1-0 win at Union in the regular-season finale. Nazareth then defeated Elmira, 5-0, in the first round of the E8 Tournament, setting up the showdown with Ithaca.

In addition to Brown, Nardini, and Snyder, Mallia earned first team E8 All-Star honors. Kala Caster (10 goals, 1 assist) joined Corcoran as a second-team choice.

The Golden Flyers were ranked 18th nationally in the final poll conducted by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.



The women's soccer program began in 1983 at the urging of then-President Robert A. Kidera, an ardent sports advocate and a charter inductee to the Nazareth Sports Hall of Fame in 1995.

Jacklin Randall-Ward, a high school teacher at nearby Honeoye Falls-Lima, was selected as the first coach and her fierce style was instrumental in making the program competitive from the outset. With the simple goal of winning more games than they lost, the Golden Flyers were successful in finishing 6-5-2 in 1983. Four straight seasons of double-digit victories followed until the team finally cracked the national rankings in 1986, peaking at No. 14.

Star players included Hall of Famers Lynne Stever, who amassed 98 career goals to break a national scoring record that has since been broken; Angela Coniglio, who contributed 42 goals and 115 career points; and Liz O'Leary, a four-year starter who anchored the defense.

For the six seasons covering 1988 through 1993 (under coaches Ron Bartlett, Chuck Salamone, and finally Gail Mann), the Golden Flyers struggled mightily, never cracking the .500 barrier. Nazareth averaged nearly nine wins per season through the first decade, but 56 of the Golden Flyers' 86 wins came in the first five seasons.

"There were some growing pains," said Mann, "With all the coaching changes, it was difficult to establish any consistency."

The program underwent a dramatic transformation under the direction of Mann, who arrived in 1993 and led the team past the .500 mark at 9-8-2 in just her second season (1994). The 1996 season provided another yardstick as Nazareth won 16 games and were invited to the ECAC Upstate Tournament for the first time.

The arrival of Rita Bartucca helped propel the Golden Flyers as she delivered 27 goals over the 1995 and 1996 seasons. Michelle Urbanski (49 career goals) arrived in 1996 along with two-time All-American midfielder Melanie Northrup to provide evidence that the Golden Flyers were on the threshold of making an impact on the national level.

Yet another milestone was realized in 1997 when Nazareth claimed its first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. The Golden Flyers cruised through an unbeaten regular season (15-0-2) and then scored a thrilling 3-2 triple overtime win over Oneonta in their first-ever NCAA game. Nazareth lost in the next round to Rochester, but the groundwork had clearly been laid with the idea that Nazareth would be a post-season fixture in women's soccer thereafter

Nazareth's ascent to the national spotlight progressed further in 1999 as the Golden Flyers won the first Empire 8 Conference title, then scored wins over Oneonta and William Smith to capture the NCAA New York Region title. The Golden Flyers won 17 games that year before losing to Williams in the national quarterfinals. Jaime Snyder and Heidi Brown are among the recent players who enjoyed strong playing careers. Snyder broke the single-season and career assist records and earned All-American honors in 2001. Brown, a steady defender, was Empire 8 Player of the Year and a second-team All-American in 2002.

Heading into the 2003 season (and the third decade), Nazareth has made six straight NCAA Tournament appearances after winning 129 games over the second 10-year span.

Now it's on to decade number three.

Golden Flyers take aim.

Nazareth rebuilding toward Empire 8 Title, another NCAA Tournament bid.

While it isn't exactly tantamount to reconstructing the World Trade Center, rebuilding the Nazareth women's soccer team in 2003 could be one of head coach Gail Mann's most daunting challenges.

The Golden Flyers began the pre-season minus eight seniors who made significant contributions over a four-year stretch that brought 59 victories, four Empire 8 titles, four NCAA Tournament berths, and one New York

Among the departed are one All-American (stopper Heidi Brown), three first-team E8 Conference All-Stars (Brown, midfielder Stephanie Nardini, and forward Jaime Snyder), and one second-teamer (Casey Corcoran).

"We clearly have some holes to fill," said Mann, who accepts the challenge with a 131-51-12 record through 10 seasons as coach. "I think that we're as talented as last year, but probably not as deep."

The talent includes junior Laura Mallia, a first-team all-conference player, who is a stabilizing presence in the midfield. She contributed four goals and three assists in 2002 and delivered the game-clinching penalty kick at Ithaca in the E8 Conference championship game to launch the Golden Flyers into the NCAAs for the sixth straight year.

"That's our goal again," said Mann. "We want to make it to the conference championship and see what happens."

Here's a look at the Golden Flyers by position:

Defense

The loss of the unflappable Brown created a cavernous hole, but Mann is confident that the defense that yielded less than a goal per game in 2002 can remain steady.

Senior Lisa Ksczanowicz, who has missed parts of the last two seasons due to injury, is back and healthy. Junior Erin McConnell and sophomore Meagan Clark each played regularly in 2002.

Juniors Jenna Atchinson and Kieran Campbell also have experience and will compete for playing time with freshmen Dana Perla and Kim Yancone.

Midfield

Mallia, who played one season at Division I West Virginia before transferring to Nazareth last year, will bolster this area which will be revamped due to the loss of Nardini and fellow seniors Jill Ranous and Shannon Rene.

Junior Leigh Vainio will inherit one of the center midfield slots with senior Darrah Graziano, junior Erin Zillioux (6 goals), and sophomore Randi Hughes listed as strong candidates at outside midfield. All three played regular roles in 2002.

Junior Christine Fisher also returns after missing a year due to a series of leg injuries.

Freshman Keelin Brennan brings to the mix strong high school credentials as do Amanda Prosser, Jessica Rogers, Jessemyn Russell, and Rosanne Simiele.

Forward

The Golden Flyers' offensive firepower took a jolt with a loss of Corcoran and Snyder, who combined to score 16 goals in 2002.

Mann hopes to reload with senior Kala Caster (10 goals), a second-team E8 all-star and the team's leading goal scorer. Senior Kristen Lempicki (6 goals, 6 assists) also developed a reliable scoring touch as did junior Beth Berger (6 goals, 3 assists). Mann also hopes for a similar contribution from sophomore Ashley Thayer.

Candace Hatcher returns for her senior season after posting a 0.80 goalsagainst average with nine shutouts. She also had 56 saves in 21 starts.

"Last year, all of our depth came in the form of sophomores and juniors." said Mann. "This season, we will be relying on some of the freshmen to come through for us. We also have some people who may not have played that much in the past who will get an opportunity to step in and contribute."




