





Golden Flyers' Head Coach

Assistant Coaches & Post Season Play



GAIL MANN - HEAD COACH



Returning for her 12th season as head coach of the women's soccer team, Gail Mann is by far the Golden Flyers' most successful women's soccer coach ever – in terms of victories, longevity, and postseason success.

Last year's record of 11-5-4 marked the Golden Flyers' ninth straight season of double-digit victories. The Golden Flyers also won the Empire 8 Conference title for the fifth year in a row and missed out on their seventh straight trip to the NCAA Tournament by one stray penalty kick.

Mann has been the driving force behind all of the Golden Flyers' foremost achievements since taking over as coach in 1993. In just her second season, the Golden Flyers finished 9-8-2 and reached the NYSWCAA tournament. In 1996, Mann guided the Golden Flyers to a record of 16-6-1, and led the team to berths in the NYSWCAA and ECAC Mid-Atlantic Tournaments.

The progression continued in 1997 as Nazareth finished 16-1-2 and landed its first NCAA Tournament berth. Nazareth's first

NCAA game was a memorable one – a 3-2 triple overtime win over Oneonta. Mann was recognized that year as New York Region Coach of the Year, an honor that was duplicated in 2002. In 1999, Nazareth set a school record with 17 wins and captured the NCAA New York Region title. They equaled that school record in 2002 by finishing 17-4-1. Mann was named NYSWCAA Coach of the Year in 1996 and Empire 8 co-Coach of the Year in 1999.

Mann's overall record of 142-56-16 gives her a winning percentage (.701) that ranks among the top 20 in Division III for active coaches. Since 1995, she has coached 35 NYSWCAA all-star selections, 27 Northeast Region All-Stars, and four All-Americans.

A native of Rochester, Mann came to Nazareth in 1993 after five seasons as an assistant coach at SUNY Brockport. She was head coach of the New York West Olympic Development U-15 team from 1992-1998 and won the Region 1 championship in 1995.

Mann is a graduate of Spencerport High School, where she excelled in soccer, basketball, and softball. She played soccer at Cortland State and was a starting striker on the 1986 team which reached the Division III Final Four. At Nazareth, in addition to coaching soccer, Mann was an assistant coach for the Golden Flyers' women's lacrosse team, which reached the NCAA Tournament in 2000, 2002, and 2004.

<u> BILLY STOJANOVSKI - ASSISTANT COACH</u>



Billy Stojanovski joined the Nazareth coaching staff in 2000 and has helped guide the Golden Flyers to three NCAA tournament berths. Along with serving as the Golden Flyers' head assistant, Stojanovski trains the goalkeepers.

A native of Rochester, Stojanovski played three seasons of soccer at Division I University of Buffalo as a goalkeeper and still ranks among

the program's all-time leaders in saves and goals-against average. He graduated from Buffalo with a degree in mechanical engineering and has worked at Xerox since 1994.

Before coming to Nazareth, Stojanovski was an assistant coach at RIT for

three seasons. He also has coached the Rochester Junior Rhinos since 1998 and helped direct them to a state title in 1999.

His coaching experience also includes a stint with Buffalo Germania from 1994-97 (two State Cup Championships and two regional appearances, and the first New York State West girls club team to reach the regional semifinals) and involvement with the Rochester District Olympic Development program.

For the past four years he has assisted in the women's scholastic division of the Empire State Games and has helped the Western New York team to three gold medals and one bronze medal.

Stojanovski resides in Rochester with his wife, Cheryl, daughter Reese and son Evan.

SANDY DROR BRODY - ASSISTANT COACH



Sandy Brody begins her second season with the Golden Flyers as a part-time assistant coach. Brody grew up in Florida and excelled in soccer, softball, and volleyball at Taravella High in Coral Springs. She went on to play Division I soccer at the University of North Carolina-Asheville, where she helped the team win the Big South Conference title in 1995.

She graduated from UNC Asheville in 1997 with a degree in Mathematics. Since then, she has fulfilled teaching requirements in physical education and has had teaching assignments at Marcus Whitman Central in Rushville, N.Y. and at Brighton Central. She also has experience as an area soccer official.

Brody resides in Rochester with her husband, Harlan, and works as a real estate manager.

2003 Season in Review





Golden Flyers Gain Empire 8 Co-championship

TEAM FINISHES 11-5-4, COMPETES IN ECACS

For a team that measures success through the number of NCAA Tournament appearances made, the Nazareth women's soccer team experienced disappointment in 2003.

The degree of difficulty, however, that accompanies each postseason attempt is an important factor upon closer scrutiny of the Golden Flyers' 2003 campaign.

"You can't always measure success through wins and losses," said head coach Gail Mann, whose team reached double digits in victories for the ninth straight time. "We were a very closeknit unit that enjoyed playing soccer together."

Seeking their seventh straight NCAA Tournament berth, the Golden Flyers came within one stray penalty kick in the Empire 8 Championship game against Ithaca of reaching that milestone.

Instead, following the scoreless tie with the Bombers, Nazareth and Ithaca were declared conference co-champions. Ithaca represented the conference in the NCAAs, however, thanks to a 4-3 edge in penalty kicks.

Nazareth then competed in the ECAC Mid-Atlantic Tournament and saw its season come to a halt with a 4-0 home field loss to the University of Rochester.

The Golden Flyers suffered two ties and two losses in their first five games before embarking on a seven-game winning streak that reestablished the team as one of the best in the New York Region.

Nazareth finished 7-0 in Empire 8 Conference play to gain the top seed and home-field advantage for the E8 Tournament. Nazareth defeated RIT, 5-1, in a first-round game, then battled through 110 minutes of scoreless soccer with Ithaca, marking the second year in a row that the two teams played to a 0-0 tie in the E8 title game.

Unlike 2002, though, when the Golden Flyers advanced to the NCAAs through penalty kicks, Ithaca turned the tables, using a 4-3 advantage to advance.

"We found out the hard way that it's a tough way to lose," Mann said. "We did the best we could, but someone had to advance."

Among the consolation prizes was an array of post-season awards, including first-team all-conference honors for junior

striker Beth Berger, junior midfielders Laura Mallia and Erin Zillioux, and sophomore defender Meagan Clark.

Senior forward Kristen Lempicki (5 goals, 7 assists), senior goalie Candace Hatcher, and junior defender Lisa Ksczanowicz were second-team selections, and junior defender Erin McConnell made honorable mention.

Berger led the Golden Flyers in scoring with 14 goals, while Mallia and Zillioux contributed six and five goals respectively.

Clark anchored a defense that yielded just 20 goals and was responsible for six shutouts.



Kristen Lempicki was the Golden Flyers' second leading scorer in 2003 with five goals and seven assists.



Guarded Optimism

GOLDEN FLYERS LOOK TO CONTEND FOR EMPIRE 8 TITLE. RETURN TO NCAA TOURNAMENT

November seemed a bit emptier for the Nazareth women's soccer team in 2003. Seeking their seventh straight NCAA Division III Tournament appearance, the Golden Flyers were denied that berth as Ithaca represented the Empire 8 Conference after outlasting the Golden Flyers in penalty kicks.

Nazareth was officially declared conference co-champion (following a 0-0 tie with Ithaca in the E8 title game), but that seemed like a small consolation after not making the NCAAs.

"That's our goal every year," said Nazareth Coach Gail Mann, now in her 12th season. "We want to make the conference tournament and compete for the Empire 8 Championship."


The Golden Flyers lost just three starters from 2003 and have reloaded with 10 new players, including junior transfer Kristina Cristofori, the second leading scorer at Syracuse in 2003.

Here's a position-by-position breakdown:

Forward

Nazareth College is a private, co-educational college with a liberal arts and sciences core. Founded in 1924 by the Sisters of St. Joseph, Nazareth has been independent for more than 30 years.

Nazareth's Athletic Mission and Philosophy

The Nazareth College Athletic Department will strive to empower its student-athletes to grow as people and make a positive impact on society, with life-skills development, mentoring, and leadership opportunities through competitive and cooperative experiences.

The Athletic Department is committed to assisting in the college's mission of educating students with a goal of fostering lifelong commitment to intellectual, ethical and aesthetic values. The Athletic Department will operate under firm institutional control of the college and will always place the health and welfare of the student-athletes, coaches and staff first in decisions regarding the athletics program.

The department will operate under the NCAA Division III philosophy, through which academics are the student's first priority and sportsmanship, fair play, diversity and ethical conduct are constantly taught and promoted.

Campus Expansion

In 2000, Nazareth contracted to purchase 73 acres of property and buildings adjacent to the current campus from the college's founders, the Sisters of St. Joseph. This opportunity doubles the size of the campus and will enable the college to shape its future in ways previously unimaginable.

A three-phase master plan that will be implemented over the next five to seven years, will integrate the existing campus with the newly acquired property into one seamless and architecturally consistent landscape. New academic programs, including a Master of Arts in Liberal Studies, a four-year Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, and Information Technology have been joined by new athletic programs in cross country, equestrian, men's soccer, and track and field.

Undergraduate enrollment is projected to reach 2,000 students within the next five years.

Enrollment

Full-time undergraduate enrollment for the fall of 2004 will be approximately 1,800. That number increases to about 3,200 with the inclusion of part-time and graduate students. There are more than 1,150 students living on campus.

The 2004-05 freshman class had a mean SAT score of 1140. Over 33 percent finished in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class; 70 percent ranked in the top 25 percent.

Academic Highlights

- During the past 16 years, 27 Nazareth students have won Fulbright grants to carry out research, teach, and study in 13 countries around the world. Few colleges and universities in the nation can match Nazareth's record of preparing students for success in the Fulbright competition—the U.S. government's most prestigious scholarship program.
- Nazareth has a distinguished history of teacher preparation with nearly 1,700 graduates currently teaching in Monroe County classrooms.
- Nazareth features an array of health professions programs, including a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Music Therapy, Art Therapy, Speech-Language Pathology, and Physical Therapy.
- The Nazareth College Arts Center, which houses the departments of Theatre Arts, Music, and Art, has welcomed more than two million people to performances since it opened in 1967.

Community Service

Ninety-one percent of Nazareth undergraduates participate in community service projects while they are students. In addition, Nazareth offers an on-campus Center for Service Learning, which serves as a resource for students seeking volunteer placements and for faculty who want to incorporate service into the curriculum.

Alumn

Seventy-five percent of Nazareth's 23,000 alumni reside in New York state. Nearly 70 percent are employed in service professions including education, health care, child care, social work, and counseling.

Athletic Highlights

- The average grade-point average of student-athletes for the spring 2004 semester was 3.06.
- A member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Nazareth has 21 intercollegiate teams that compete at the Division III level.
 Nazareth also competes in the Empire 8 Conference with Alfred, Elmira, Hartwick, Ithaca, RIT, St. John Fisher, and Utica.
- Nazareth's men's lacrosse team won national championships in 1992, 1996, and 1997.
- Nazareth finished 74th in the NACDA (National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics) standings for Division III for in 2003-04 for its second highest finish ever. The Golden Flyers were represented in NCAA Tournaments in women's soccer, men's lacrosse, and women's lacrosse. Nazareth also claimed Empire 8 Conference titles in men's soccer, women's soccer, women's soccer, men's golf, and men's lacrosse.
