### HEAD COACH

Returning for her 13th season as head coach of the women's soccer team, Gail Mann has helped Nazareth maintain its standing among the nation's elite women's soccer programs for more than a decade.

Last year's 11-5-2 record marked the Golden Flyers' 10th straight season of double digit victories. Nazareth also has either shared or won outright the Empire 8 Conference title for six straight years.

They made six straight NCAA tournament appearances from 1997 through 2002. Only a couple of stray penalty kicks steered them away in 2003 and 2004. Mann has been the driving force behind all of the Golden Flyers' foremost achievements since taking over as coach in 1993. In just her second season, the Golden Flyers finished 9-8-2 and reached the NYSWCAA tournament. In 1996, Mann guided the Golden Flyers to a record of 16-6-1, and led the team to berths in the NYSWCAA and ECAC Mid-Atlantic Tournaments.

The progression continued in 1997 as Nazareth finished 16-1-2 and landed its first NCAA Tournament berth. Nazareth's first NCAA game was a memorable one – a 3-2 triple overtime win over Oneonta. Mann was recognized that year as New York Region Coach of the Year, an honor that was duplicated in 2002. In 1999, Nazareth set a school record with 17 wins and captured the NCAA New York

Region title. They equaled that school record in 2002 by finishing 17-4-1. Mann was named NYSWCAA Coach of the Year in 1996 and Empire 8 co-Coach of the Year in 1999.

Mann's overall record of 153-61-18 gives her a winning percentage (.698) that ranks among the top 20 in Division III for active coaches.

Since 1995, she has coached 39 NYSWCAA all-star selections, 31 Northeast Region all-stars, and five All-Americans.

A native of Rochester, Mann came to Nazareth in 1993 after five seasons as an assistant coach at SUNY Brockport.

She was head coach of the New York West Olympic Development U-15 team from 1992-1998 and won the Region 1 championship in 1995.

Mann is a graduate of Spencerport High School, where she excelled in soccer, basketball, and softball. She played soccer at Cortland State and was a starting striker on the 1986 team that reached the Division III Final Four. At Nazareth, in addition to coaching soccer, Mann was an assistant coach for the Golden Flyers' women's lacrosse team for 10 seasons and helped Nazareth to NCAA Tournament berths in 2000, 2002 and 2004.

**Billy Stojanovski**

**ASSISTANT COACH**

Billy Stojanovski joined the Nazareth coaching staff in 2000 and has helped guide the Golden Flyers to five Empire 8 Conference titles and three NCAA tournament berths. Along with serving as the Golden Flyers' head assistant, Stojanovski trains the goalkeepers.

A native of Rochester, Stojanovski played three seasons of soccer at Division I University of Buffalo as a goalkeeper and still ranks among the program's all-time leaders in saves and goals-against average. He graduated from Buffalo with a degree in mechanical engineering and has worked at Xerox since 1994.

Before coming to Nazareth, Stojanovski was an assistant coach at RIT for three seasons. He also has coached the Rochester Junior Rhinos since 1998 and helped direct them to a state title in 1999.

His coaching experience also includes a stint with Buffalo Germania from 1994-97 (two State Cup Championships and two regional appearances, and the first New York State West girls club team to reach the regional semifinals) and involvement with the Rochester District Olympic Development program.

He also has assisted in the women's scholastic division of the Empire State Games and has helped the Western New York team to three gold medals and one bronze medal.

Stojanovski resides in Rochester with his wife, Cheryl, daughter Reese and son Evan.



**Sandy Brody**

**ASSISTANT COACH**

Sandy Brody begins her third season with the Golden Flyers as a part-time assistant coach.

Brody grew up in Florida and excelled in soccer, softball, and volleyball at Taravella High in Coral Springs. She went on to play Division I soccer at the University of North Carolina-Asheville, where she helped the team win the Big South Conference title in 1995.

She graduated from UNC Asheville in 1997 with a degree in Mathematics. Since then, she has fulfilled teaching requirements in physical education and has had teaching assignments at Marcus Whitman Central in Rushville, N.Y. and at Brighton Central. She also has experience as an area soccer official.

Brody resides in Rochester with her husband, Harlan, and works as a real estate manager.

## Golden Flyers gain E8 co-championship

### 10TH STRAIGHT SEASON OF DOUBLE DIGIT VICTORIES

The good news in 2004 was that the Nazareth women's soccer team won its sixth straight Empire 8 Conference title and, with a record of 11-5-2, posted its 10th straight season of double digit victories.

Despite the remarkable success, there was no post-season tournament to help the Golden Flyers' celebrate.

Nazareth's grit and determination were never more evident than in the E8 title game at Ithaca Nov. 6 when the Golden Flyers scored twice in the final 13 minutes (including the game-tying score by Erin Zillioux with just 57 seconds left in regulation) to force a 2-2 tie.

Ithaca and Nazareth shared the conference title for the third year in a row, but Ithaca gained the conference's automatic berth to the NCAAs by outscoring Nazareth 9-8 in penalty kicks.

"It was a tough way for our season to end," said Nazareth Coach Gail Mann. "Even though we were declared conference co-champions, losing in penalty kicks takes away some of the luster."

In truth, though, the season was full of luster as an 8-2-1 start vaulted the Golden Flyers into their customary position in the national rankings. Early-season non-conference wins over Brockport, Geneseo and Cortland helped build momentum.

Nazareth finished 6-0-1 in conference games with a 3-3 tie at Ithaca setting up a deadlock atop the E8 regular-season standings.

After the Golden Flyers dominated Elmira, 6-0, in the opening round of the E8 Tournament, Nazareth lost home-field advantage for the E8 title game on a coin flip.

With the game tied 2-2 after 90 minutes, the teams played two scoreless 10-minute overtime periods to become co-champs.

In the penalty kick session, each team converted its first eight attempts — Beth Berger, Leigh Vainio, Erin McConnell, Meagan Clark, Kristina Cristofori, Jenna Atchinson, Jamie Witkiewicz, and Kim Yancone scored for Nazareth — before a shot by Nazareth freshman Julie Birbilis was saved by Ithaca keeper Aimee Meacham. Ithaca's Mallory Gilman then made her team's ninth attempt to send the Bombers to the NCAAs for the second straight year.

The consolation prize for Nazareth was an array of post-season awards, including the selection of the program's first-ever first-team All-American in junior midfielder Kristina Cristofori.

Cristofori made a decisive impact for the Golden Flyers after transferring to Nazareth from Syracuse University. She led the Golden Flyers in scoring with 11 goals and two assists and was selected E8 Player of the Year.

Three others were chosen as first-team E8 all-stars in senior forward Beth Berger, senior midfielder Laura Mallia and senior defender Lisa Ksczanowicz.

Junior defender Meagan Clark was named to the second team and honorable mention honors went to senior midfielder Erin Zillioux, senior defender Erin McConnell and freshman goalie Holly Sands.

Berger and McConnell also were selected to the District 1 Academic all-star team.

## Golden Flyers look to contend for Empire 8 title with speed, youth

## YOUTH MOVEMENT

There won't be a bull's-eye stuck to the back of Kristina Cristofori's uniform this fall, but it might seem that way.

The returning senior midfielder figures to be a marked woman for the Golden Flyers' women's soccer team in 2005.

Cristofori scored 11 goals and added two assists to lead the Golden Flyers (11-5-2) last season and was recognized as the program's first-ever first-team All-American.

She will be the centerpiece of Nazareth's fortunes in '05 as the Golden Flyers look to compete for the Empire 8 Conference championship and the accompanying automatic berth to the NCAA Division III Tournament.

Nazareth made six straight NCAA appearances from 1997 through 2002,

but have been turned away the last two seasons via penalty kicks.

This year's team, according to 13th-year head coach Gail Mann, is young but very talented with emphasis on speed and quickness.

"We'll count heavily on the on-field leadership of Kristina (Cristofori) and (senior defender) Meagan Clark," Mann said, "but much of our success this season will depend on the development of the younger players."

The 26-player roster features 11 new players, including 10 freshmen.

Here's a position-by-position breakdown:

## FORWARD

Nazareth will try to overcome the graduation loss of Beth Berger, who scored 22 goals over the last two seasons and ranks sixth all-time at Nazareth in career scoring.

Mann is confident that junior Rosie Simiele (5 goals, 4 assists in 2004) can pick up some of the scoring slack in her first season as a starter. She hopes to get scoring help from speedy freshmen Rachel Cushman, Kelly Finn and Sandi Toth as well as sophomore Caroline Parsons.

## MIDFIELD

Cristofori, the 2004 Empire 8 Player of the Year, returns to bolster the center midfield area with versatile junior Jessemyn Russell a solid candidate to occupy one of the outside spots.

Sophomore Maggie Boyle, a transfer from St. Bonaventure, brings strong credentials (including speed) to the mix. Senior Ashley Thayer and sophomores Amanda Browning and Caity Richardson will play prominent roles as will a group of talented freshmen, including Taryn Bilodeau, Ashley Clinton and Jocelyn Jankowski.

## DEFENSE

Senior Meagan Clark, a two-time Empire 8 Conference all-star, will be the anchor defensively alongside junior Jessica

Rogers, who started regularly in 2004.

Senior Randi Hughes, juniors Amanda Prosser and Kim Yancone and sophomore Julie Birbilis provide experience and speed to the backfield.

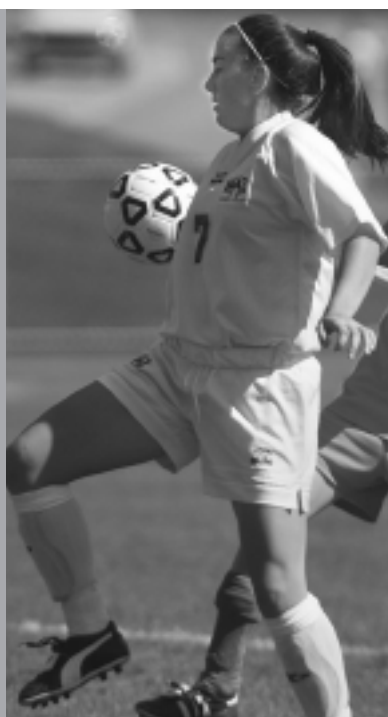

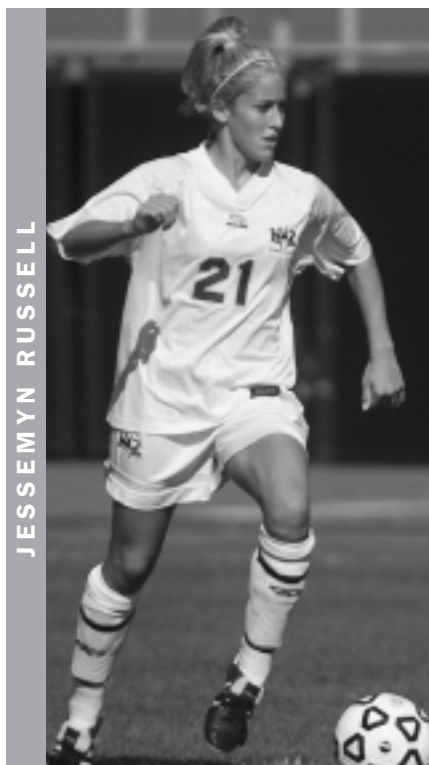

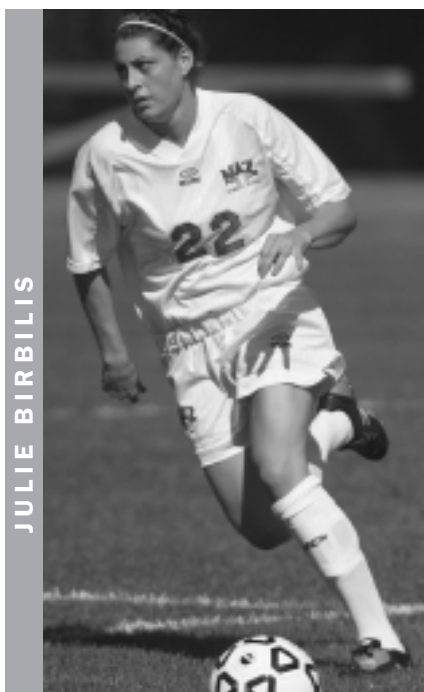

In 2001 the conference announced its official brand identity (Empire 8 or E8) and launched its informational web site. E8 offers 15 conference champion sports – Baseball, Men's & Women's Basketball, Cross Country, Golf, Men's & Women's Lacrosse, Men's & Women's Soccer, Softball, Men's & Women's Swimming/Diving, Men's & Women's Tennis & Volleyball.

## Nazareth's athletic mission and philosophy

The Nazareth College Athletic Department will strive to empower its student-athletes to grow as people and make a positive impact on society, with life-skills development, mentoring, and leadership opportunities through competitive and cooperative experiences.

The Athletic Department is committed to assisting in the college's mission of educating students with a goal of fostering lifelong commitment to intellectual, ethical and aesthetic values. The Athletic Department will operate under firm institutional control of the college and will always place the health and welfare of the student-athletes, coaches and staff first in decisions regarding the athletics program.

The department will operate under the NCAA Division III philosophy, through which academics are the student's first priority and sportsmanship, fair play, diversity and ethical conduct are constantly taught and promoted.

## Campus expansion

2004 marked the completion of Nazareth's largest capital campaign in history. The college raised \$25 million to support the recent campus expansion through the purchase of 73 acres of adjoining land and buildings. Today's campus features 148 acres and includes the five-story Golisano Academic Center, the 2,200-seat Golden Flyer stadium, the spacious Elizabeth George and Portka residence halls and a softball diamond.

Students now have twice as many classrooms and computer labs; more undergraduate and graduate programs; opportunities to compete on intercollegiate teams in equestrian, cross country, track and field and men's volleyball; and a choice of living options that includes suites, cafes and free laundry service.

## Enrollment

The 2005-2006 freshman class had a mean SAT score of 1152. One third of incoming freshmen finished in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class; two-thirds ranked in the top 25 percent.

## Academic highlights

Seventy-five percent of Nazareth's 23,000 alumni reside in New York state. Nearly 70 percent are employed in service professions including education, health care, child care, social work, and counseling.
